From the Administrator

Growing through change.

The Villages of Lonsdale Enjoying New Library

When talk of a senior living campus being built in Lonsdale began, Mayor Tim Rud proposed a mutually beneficial arrangement with Three Links contracting with a builder to erect a structure that would also include space for a public library and some meeting rooms. The agreement was that the city would finance the construction and in return would have a 30 year lease at \$1 per year of the approximately 4,000 square foot space included in the ground floor for a library. Residents of the Villages of Lonsdale have their own entrance to the library lobby so that they do not have to walk outside in inclement weather to pick out a book to read or to sit and peruse the local newspapers. The generous donation of an OVAC magnifier from a local resident aids seniors with vision impairments who cannot read fine print and library staff do their best to make the Villages residents feel as if they are simply stepping into another room of their home. Many residents visit the Lonsdale Public Library on a daily basis. Recently, a woman came into the library and introduced herself to Director, Diana Tallent, who was pleased to hear that the woman's father made his decision to move into Villages because of the library being on site. The partnership has been so successful that Elko New Market has plans to copy the arrangement.

Three Link Volunteer- Jason Hallen



Jason Hallen came to Three Links in June of 2008 having recently graduated from Carleton College earning a degree in Sociology and Anthropology. Jason was eager to fill in some of his time doing something of value during the summer until his new job position began in the fall. When he came to the volunteer coordinator with “many hours available and willing to assist where needed”, he was quickly plugged in with a variety of activities. Jason quickly learned all that is involved in resident bus outings; gathering up the residents, assisting them onto the bus and double checking seat belts. Residents were eager to save the seat next to them on the bus for Jason because they all enjoyed his company. He was essential for the extra labor needed for special outings where the residents get off

the bus such as the Annual Lutefisk supper. Having grown up in Glenview, Illinois, a northern suburb of Chicago, Jason was never really exposed to the Norwegian tradition of lutefisk but somehow he had been exposed to its bad reputation. As he sat with residents at the lutefisk meal he approached the fish with suspicion, but after a couple bites he said “I don’t know why this stuff got such a bad rap! It’s delicious!” and to the delight of the residents he proceeded to down three platefuls! Jason has now attended 3 fall Lutefisk suppers and states that it’s something he really enjoys.

Over that first summer Jason was putting in about 7-8 hours a week, helping in the Gift Shop once a week, assisting with Bingo every Wednesday, and helping with bus rides. After that initial summer of steady volunteering Jason got a position with Americore, helping underachieving students at the Middle School to reach their full potential. He says that even though this position was challenging, it was very gratifying as he really felt that he was making a difference in these young people’s lives. With the new position, Jason was now busy during the work week but still felt a strong commitment to his residents at Three Links. He began volunteering every Saturday which is what he has continued to do for 2 full years. Jason’s Saturday activity is playing one of the three games that he alternates; Card Bingo, Horseracing and Bowling. He comes about 45 minutes early in order to “work the crowd”. He helps the Activity Assistant finish serving the coffee and snacks then reminds them to stick around for the game. Early in the day when activities announces the up-coming programs for the day the residents often ask “Will Jason be there?” They love to have him there because he is such a cheerleader. During horseracing you’ll likely see Jason’s arms flailing in the air as someone’s little wooden horse is close to the finish line. “You’re so close! Almost there! But the red one is catching up!!” His enthusiasm during the games is so infectious that Saturday afternoons are definitely one of the most eagerly anticipated activities of the week. ■

Roasted Fall Vegetables

Prep: 20 minutes
Total: 1 hour 20 minutes

Serves 8; Makes about 12 cups.

- 2 pounds (about 1 medium) butternut squash, peeled, seeded, and cut into 1½ inch pieces
- 2 pounds red new potatoes (12 to 14), well scrubbed and quartered
- 1 pound medium red onions (about 2 to 3), peeled and quartered
- 1 pound carrots (6 to 8 medium), halved lengthwise, if thick, and cut into 1½ inch lengths
- 4 to 6 garlic cloves, peeled and smashed
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- Coarse salt and ground pepper

DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 450°. Divide vegetables and garlic between two rimmed baking sheets (or line with parchment paper, if desired, for easy cleanup); dividing evenly, toss with oil, 2 teaspoons coarse salt, and ¼ teaspoon pepper. Roast until vegetables are tender and beginning to brown, 40 to 50 minutes, tossing them and rotating sheets from top to bottom halfway through. Serve hot or at room temperature.

- Pour off any accumulated liquid before using.
